



INVESTMENT OBJECTIVES AND POLICIES

The BOCHK Global Equity Fund aims to achieve long-term capital growth by investing mainly (at least 70% of its non-cash assets) in major global stock markets, including but not limited to the United States, the United Kingdom, Germany, France and Japan. The Sub-Fund invests in equities and equity related securities (including warrants and convertible securities). The allocation of the Sub-Fund's portfolio between countries and regions may vary according to the Manager's discretion and perception of prevailing and anticipated market conditions and as a result, the Sub-Fund's portfolio may be concentrated in certain country(ies) or region(s). The Sub-Fund may invest up to 30% of its assets in SFC authorized collective investment schemes ("CISs") (including CISs managed by the Manager). The Sub-Fund may invest (a) up to 10% of its Net Asset Value in A shares ((i) directly through the Shanghai-Hong Kong Stock Connect and/or Shenzhen-Hong Kong Stock Connect; and/or (ii) indirectly through investment in exchange traded funds (including ETFs managed by the Manager) and/or SFC authorised CISs (including CISs managed by the Manager); and/or (b) up to 5% of its Net Asset Value in B shares listed on the stock exchanges in Mainland China. The Sub-Fund's aggregate exposure to A shares and B shares will not exceed 10% of its Net Asset Value. Also, the Sub-Fund may employ a portion of its assets in futures contracts, options or forward currency transactions for the purposes of efficient portfolio management and hedging against exchange rate risk. The Sub-Fund may also invest in other equity related securities such as ADRs (American depository receipts) and GDRs (global depository receipts) which may be listed on various stock exchanges.

MANAGER'S COMMENT##

- Global equities struggled to find direction and closed lower for the month. The market jittered on renewed concerns over financial stability of regional banks and looming sovereign default risk in the US. Disappointing macro data from China also put downward pressure on European markets, its major trade partners, as investors debated global recession risks and the sustainability of the Chinese economy.
- Optimism briefly returned upon the earnings beat from a mega-cap chipmaker, pushing Artificial Intelligence-related growth stocks higher. A tentative agreement of raising the debt ceiling in the US also lifted market sentiment but was not enough to offset weakness in cyclical/value names on recession risks and trading reversions.
- Global inflation saw further moderation on weaker energy prices, yet consumer picture is less clear. While household spending held up in the US, consumers were becoming discerning in EU and China as recovery was seen uneven across economic segments.
- Weaker global demand and tighter credit conditions translated into further slowdown in manufacturing and investments around the world. Divergent labour market condition across regions continued to add uncertainty to global central banks' actions.
- The Sub-Fund is underweight US and overweight Asia Pacific equities to reflect the difference in growth and inflation outlook across these regions. Although the current tightening cycle of central banks is coming to a pause, tighter liquidity conditions might add stress to economic development. The Sub-Fund monitors closely the need to revise its allocation.
