



## INVESTMENT OBJECTIVES AND POLICIES

The BOCHK Global Equity Fund aims to achieve long-term capital growth by investing mainly (at least 70% of its non-cash assets) in major global stock markets, including but not limited to the United States, the United Kingdom, Germany, France and Japan. The Sub-Fund invests in equities and equity related securities (including warrants and convertible securities). The Sub-Fund may invest (a) up to 10% of its Net Asset Value in A shares ((i) directly through the Shanghai-Hong Kong Stock Connect and/or Shenzhen-Hong Kong Stock Connect; and/or (ii) indirectly through investment in exchange traded funds ("ETFs") listed on the Stock Exchange of Hong Kong Limited (including ETFs managed by the Manager) and/or SFC authorised collective investment schemes ("CISs") (including CISs managed by the Manager)); and/or (b) up to 5% of its Net Asset Value in B shares listed on the stock exchanges in Mainland China. The Sub-Fund's aggregate exposure to A shares and B shares will not exceed 10% of its Net Asset Value. Also, the Sub-Fund may employ a portion of its assets in futures contracts, options or forward currency transactions for the purposes of efficient portfolio management and hedging against exchange rate risk. The Sub-Fund may also invest in other equity related securities such as ADRs (American depository receipts) and GDRs (global depository receipts) which may be listed on various stock exchanges.

## MANAGER'S COMMENT##

#### On Market

US China trade war has been escalating during the month: higher and/or new tariffs were announced before the next round of trade talk. Italy's Prime Minister resigned then dramatically returned as Prime Minister to form a new government but to exclude hardline leader Matteo Salvini from power. UK economy remained mixed and uncertainty over "Brexit" continued to dampen business confidence. Japan's second quarter GDP surprised on the upside, marking a third quarter of expansion while macro data painted a picture of lackluster growth in the Asia economy. Going forward, the possibility for more interest rate cuts this year is higher than before

Global equity market fell in August, with Japan performing the best in USD term. Sino US trade dispute heated up again after the US imposed tariffs on the remaining Chinese exports to the US. UK equity market dropped last month as trade tensions and uncertainty over "Brexit" weighed on investors confidence. Concerns of further escalation in US-China trade friction resurfaced again. Energy related names underperformed the most while conservative sector such as Utilities outperformed.

## On Portfolio

The Sub-Fund underperformed the reference index MSCI AC World Daily TR Net USD in August. Property names were the major drag. Moving ahead, global equities would likely remain volatile amid the unstable backdrop. Trade dispute and geopolitical development would continue to drive equity market movement.

The value of the investment products managed by BOCI-Prudential Asset Management Limited represents 8.5% of the Sub-Fund's fund size.
