

INVESTMENT OBJECTIVES AND POLICIES

The BOCHK Asia Pacific Equity Fund seeks to achieve long-term capital growth by investing at least 70% of its non-cash assets in equities on the various stock markets in Asia Pacific. It is intended that the Sub-Fund markets in Asia Pacific. It is intended that the Sub-Fund will not invest in equities in Japan. The Sub-Fund may invest (a) up to 10% of its Net Asset Value in A shares ((i) directly through the Shanghai-Hong Kong Stock Connect and/or Shenzhen-Hong Kong Stock Connect; and/or (ii) indirectly through investment in exchange traded funds ("ETFs") listed on the Stock Exchange of Hong Kong Limited (including ETFs managed by the Manager) and/or SFC authorised collective investment schemes ("CISs") (including CISs managed by the Manager)); and/or (b) up to 5% of its Net Asset Value in 8 shares listed on the stock exchanges in Mainland B shares listed on the stock exchanges in Mainland China. The Sub-Fund's aggregate exposure to A shares and B shares will not exceed 10% of its Net Asset Value. The Sub-Fund may also invest in other equity related securities such as ADRs (American depository receipts) and GDRs (global depository receipts) which may be listed on various stock exchanges.

MANAGER'S COMMENT**

On Market

Macro data painted a picture of still lackluster growth in the Asia economy. Trade activity extended its weak run despite some improvement in semiconductor exports. Some high frequency domestic demand indicators have also softened as sluggish external demand and trade frictions have taken a toll on corporate confidence and consumer sentiments. With trade policy uncertainty lingering, risks to the region's economic outlook remain skewed to the downside. The sharp re-escalation of trade tensions and growth concerns led to continued dovishness from Asian Central Banks with New Zealand, India and Thailand all making surprise interest-rate cuts while Philippine and Indonesia delivered rate cuts as expected. Looking ahead, the easing trend is likely to continue in response to weaker macro backdrop and increasing financial market volatilities.

Asia equities retreated during the month. Renewed US-China trade tension again hit the market as US president Trump announced a new round of tariff hikes on Chinese imports starting September 1. RMB breaking through psychological level and US Treasury's decision to designate China as 'currency wanipulator' further ignited concerns over a currency war. While there was a relief rally after China took steps to limit weakness in RMB and the US delayed implementation on part of the next round of tariffs against China, the sell-off deepened again in Asia as Trump announced additional levies on Chinese Asia as finiting annualized additional review of Chinese imports following retailatory tariffs from China. Looking ahead, concerns about the potential impact of long-lasting US-China trade tensions would continue to depress investment sentiment while on-going geopolitical issues may further overhang investor confidence.

On Portfolio

The Sub-Fund registered a negative return and was behind the reference index attributable to negative stock selections in China Consumption related sector. The Sub-Fund would concentrate on both market and sector neutral strategy in order to achieve a more stable performance
