



INVESTMENT OBJECTIVES AND POLICIES

The BOCHK Hong Kong Equity Fund seeks to achieve long-term capital growth through investment mainly (at least 70% of its non-cash assets) in the listed equities and equity related securities (including warrants and convertible securities) of companies operating principally in Hong Kong, or linked either directly or indirectly to the Hong Kong economy. The Sub-Fund may employ a portion of its assets in futures contracts, options or forward currency transactions for the purposes of efficient portfolio management and hedging against exchange rate risk.

MANAGER'S COMMENT##

On Market

As expected, Hong Kong's GDP growth for the fourth quarter of 2019 continued to ease, resulting in a recessionary trend for the year. The key drag was weaker service exports and investment, reflecting the impact of local social unrest in previous months on inbound tourism and business sentiment. This has outweighed some improvement in government spending and goods trade. Meanwhile, private consumption stabilized at a low level. While we had expected a modest growth rebound in 2020, the Coronavirus outbreak has imposed downside risk to near-term outlook. In particular, the tighter travel restrictions imposed by Hong Kong government could further weigh on the already sluggish inbound tourism, and residents could cut back dining out and physical store-based consumption. The magnitude of Coronavirus impact on growth would depend on its severity and duration.

The Hong Kong equity market had a bumpy start in January. The Hang Seng Index started with a pretty strong rally, but nose dive as severity of the Coronavirus outbreak intensified and ended in the negative territory. Major drivers include: (1) The US and China signed the Phase One trade agreement on mid-January, and details were generally in-line with expectation. (2) Growing concerns over the Coronavirus outbreak. (3) Hong Kong government announced to close some border checkpoints with China in late January, and China also suspends issuing the IVS permit for Hong Kong and Macau in 49 cities. Decline was registered across the board. Reflecting the risk adverse sentiment, Utilities was the best performer. The Commercial and Industrial subsector was less hit, as strong performances from Information Technology offset the weakness in Macau gaming names. Property was the worst hit, reflecting concerns over slower residential property sales.

On Portfolio

The Sub-Fund registered a decline and underperformed the reference index. The underperformance could be attributed to overweight Information Technology, Consumer (Consumption related) and Basic Materials. In light of the uncertainties associated with development of the Coronavirus, we believe the market would remain highly volatile, with the possibility of challenging lower levels. We remain optimistic on China's medium term prospects and would look for opportunities to accumulate on industry leaders in event of market weaknesses, with preferences for exposure to domestic consumption and 5G related developments.
